



# **JUNIOR AMERICA'S CUP (GIRLS)**

## **July 23 – 27, 2018**

### **Hiwan Golf Club, Evergreen, Colorado**

The Junior America's Cup (JAC) first started in 1973 at Pebble Beach, California. The team competition annually brings together an elite international field of up to 18 teams representing 12 Western States, 2 Canadian provinces and Mexico. The 54-Hole tournament counts the best 3 scores of 4, daily, concluding with a formal Awards ceremony where Gold, Silver and Bronze medals are presented. #### **Format**

Stroke play for the team only. The Joan Teats Inspirational Team Award is also presented.

#### **Team Alberta**

- 4\* - Junior Girls (U19)
- *\*2 spots from each team will be awarded to Golf Alberta based on the 2017 Alberta Golf Order of Merit*

Players are eligible to participate in the 2018 GJAC if they are 14 years of age and have not yet reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday by the final day of competition and have not attended an institution of higher education

#### **Qualifiers**

1. April 28-29 at McKenzie Meadows Golf Club, Calgary, AB
2. May 12-13 at Woodside Golf Club, Airdrie, AB
3. May 19-20 at RedTail Landing Golf Club, Nisku, AB
4. June 9-10 at Turner Valley Golf Club, Turner Valley, AB

#### **Requirements**

Juniors who wish to qualify for CJGA Team Alberta must meet the following requirements:

- Juniors must play in a designated qualifier for the international competition.
- In order to be eligible for qualifying, juniors must meet the age requirement for the international event and compete in the proper age division at the time of the qualifier.
- Juniors must be a full member and in good standing with the Canadian Junior Golf Association.
- Juniors who are selected to represent Alberta must be either a Canadian citizen or hold a permanent resident card.

#### **Selection Process**

The CJGA Selection Committee will determine the juniors who represent CJGA Team Alberta by the following process:

1. Players will be selected by a JAC Alberta Order of Merit.
2. For each designated qualifier, points will be awarded on the player's finish using the CJGA National Order of Merit – Tier 3 point structure. See chart below.
3. Juniors not in good standing or with code of conduct violations will be removed from the list.
4. Top four (4) junior girls from the JAC Alberta Order of Merit will be selected to represent CJGA Team Alberta
5. Ties in the selection process will be decided by Section B of the CJGA Conditions of the Competition.

*\*Note: The CJGA reserves the right to select team members outside of qualifying requirements*
